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A YEAR OF MILESTONES

The Valkyrie Project is in an era of growth! We hit several major milestones this year in an effort to expand our offerings and support more military women.

Transition to Nonprofit Status

On April 27, 2023, The Valkyrie Project received federally tax-exempt nonprofit status! We are now a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. With this change, we aim to increase VP's impact through supporting greater numbers of military women and expanding our service offerings to include scholarships, research grants, and more. With expansion, VP will continue to center female-specific human performance in its programs.

Mission Statement Refinement

In November 2023, VP's board voted to update the mission statement to: "The Valkyrie Project works in the realms of human performance, education, research, and advocacy to provide American female service members the tools they need for success across the full spectrum of military service."

Military Women's Symposium 2023

In March, VP hosted the inaugural MWS, a free event advancing the dialogue on optimizing performance for military women. Proving to be a forum of global thought leadership, MWS '23 brought together over 700 individuals, inperson and virtually. 


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FINANCIALS

Bottom line up front: In 2023, **98.8%** of VP's operating costs went directly to program delivery. As always, no board members received compensation.



The Valkyrie Project currently offers two programs: the annual **Military Women's Symposium** and the continuous provision of **physical training plans for female tactical athletes (FTAs)**.

In 2023, 98.8% of VP's operating costs went directly to delivering these core programs. Costs associated with the MWS include venue fees, travel expenses for some panelists, refreshments, and videography for live streaming. Costs associated with the development and deployment of FTA-specific physical training plans include contractor wages and access to technological platforms necessary for publishing the training plans. Board members did not (and will not) receive compensation.

The remaining 1.2% of VP's operating costs were administrative in nature, funding necessities like our website and filing fees to remain in state legal compliance.

VP also made a **donation of \$2,000** to the Army Women's Foundation for use in the organization's Legacy Scholarship Program.
